Our community: The Hancock community consists of coastal villages, a quaint town center, and several small businesses and restaurants. Our church community is made up of people who live within a 30 minute radius. The town of Hancock has a population of 2394 which increases markedly in the summer.

Hancock is located within 10 minutes of Ellsworth, Maine, one of the fastest growing cities in the state. With a population of over 7500, it is home to many restaurants, antique shops, eclectic stores, theater, galleries, along with staples such as groceries and building suppliers, a hospital with emergency services and a dynamic combination of higher education and community extension services. Other local amenities include the YMCA, a large library, Stanwood Wildlife Sanctuary, two museums, the Woodlawn Museum, Gardens & Park and the Telephone Museum. Ellsworth and Hancock are only 20-30 minutes from Acadia National Park, one of the most visited national parks in the country. The surrounding region abounds with natural beauty and opportunities for hiking, swimming, fishing, hunting, biking, and much more. The local economy has a rich history of fishing, lobstering, forestry, granite quarrying, blueberry harvesting, and wreath making.

We value the Sunday worship experience but also the church family and interaction with our greater community during the week. Individual members of our congregation have been in involved in numerous service organizations and activities in Hancock County and the wider community.

Music is a significant part of worship for our church, with active adult choirs, and a seasonal bell choir.
