Spiritual growth opportunities are offered for members of our Pella Congregation and our Pella community. Children participate in Children's Church each Sunday morning during the worship hour. Weekend VBS is hosted during the summer. Family Night meets the first and third Wednesday of the month during the school year. The evening includes a meal followed by Children's Bible Club and an Adult Bible Study. Other adult spiritual growth opportunities include a Fall all-church study, a Wednesday morning study group, a Sunday morning study group plus other small group studies hosted by congregational members.

We have experienced three significant events which have breathed new life into our congregation.

Our Community Engagement team has hosted a Mother/Son Game Night and Father/Daughter Dance at a local school. Members of our congregation connected with our community families and blessed them through these events.

Pella Family Nights gathered members of our community for a meal and Bible classes for the entire family.

Our Congregation is parenting a Fresh Expression Church in Lincoln, Nebraska. Savannah Clapper, pastor of Oikos, will bless her neighborhood with the love of Jesus.

18. Buildings: Please describe church-owned or rented buildings and purpose.

Pella Church owns the church building and the parsonage. Located in a scenic rural setting, our church has a modern appearance inside and outside. The congregation surrounds the pulpit on three sides while the Praise Team is set up behind. In the past five years, new carpeting and pulpit furniture has added to the beauty of our sanctuary. Improved technology and sound equipment has enhanced our worship experience. The fellowship hall has large south facing windows providing a beautiful country view. This gathering space includes a newly remodeled kitchen which adds to our fellowship experience. Numerous side rooms provide meeting spaces for children ministries and Bible study groups.

The parsonage is located next to the church. It is a ranch home with 3 bedrooms and a bathroom on the main floor. The finished basement includes one bedroom, a large family room area and a half bath. A large, two stall garage is attached. The spacious yard includes a garden and play area adjacent to a lighted ball field that is used by the church and area ball teams.

Pella is located on State Highway 43 in the middle of 3 small communities: <u>Adams</u>, <u>Firth</u> and Panama.

Adams businesses include a physicians clinic, chiropractor, dentist, orthodontist, pharmacy, massage therapist, veterinarian, grocery, bank, retirement center/ child daycare, cafe, bar & grill, mechanics, gas station, post office, hardware store, boutique, Dollar General, fitness center, coffee/bakery, photography studio, hair salon and two churches.

Firth businesses include banks, restaurant, gas station, post office, boutique, retirement center and two churches.

Panama has a post office, bank and a church.

<u>Freeman Public Schools</u> is located in Adams. It is a Class C2 school with an enrollment of 450 students in preschool to twelfth grade. Freeman is an open enrollment school which allows students in the Pella area to option into the school system.

Norris Public Schools is located between several small communities, 7 miles from Pella. It is a Class B school with an enrollment of 2,200 students in preschool to twelfth grade. Pella is located in the Norris district.

Both schools are highly rated in the Nebraska public school system.

The city of <u>Lincoln</u> is 20 minutes from Pella. It is a friendly and vibrant city of 286,000 people which provides all the services and amenities of a larger metropolitan area. Lincoln is home to several colleges and universities including the University of Nebraska Cornhuskers. Four hospitals provide outstanding health care for Lincoln and the surrounding area.

4) Explain the strategies or ideas that most excite your church in becoming or remaining missional.

Over the past five years Pella's main focus has been on becoming more missional locally. We've learned that this can often be as simple as being present and making ourselves available. What started as pickup softball games on Pella's ballfield, has turned into hosting

Father/Daughter dances and a Mother/Son Epic Game Night at a local school. We've increased our visibility by entering a float in the local homecoming parade, providing meals and snacks to local teachers, volunteer fire departments, and retirement home workers, and by simply hanging out at the local bar on a Thursday night (Pastor attendance mandatory!). It has been wonderful to watch Pella's presence in the community grow and it has been refreshing to see how receptive the community has been. Going forward, we are eager to continue to simply make ourselves available and see how God will use us to impact the community for His glory.

5) Name three of your church's most passionate hopes and why they are significant.

At Pella Church, we are passionate about...

- Honoring God and doing His will. We strive to obediently follow His Word and His Call upon our lives.
- Building genuine relationships with Him, each other, those in our community and beyond. Through relationships we will touch the lives of those we encounter with the love of Jesus.
- Guiding and walking alongside the youth in our church as they begin their spiritual journey. We pray that they would leave these walls with a faith built upon a rock, equipped for whatever the Lord may ask of them.

A visitor to Pella is greeted with a hot cup of coffee and a friendly smile. Our hope is that our hospitality and love for the Lord are not only noticeable to a Sunday morning visitor, but also to anyone attending one of our community events or to anyone who may encounter one of our members on the street Monday through Saturday.

Two challenges facing our new pastor would be the development of new leaders and the expansion of our children's ministries.

Pella will be impacting the Kingdom through relational ministries, led by a pastor who models relational skills and leads us in developing new ministry approaches.
